### **PREPARING YOUNG PEOPLE FOR THE DEMANDS OF THE MID 21ST CENTURY: MOVING FROM BEING A GOOD SCHOOL TO BEING A GREAT ONE**

What does a great school look like? And how do you get there? Frank Crawford, Her Majesty's Chief Inspector of Education will explore the sort of actions that have been adopted successfully by schools in Scotland to impact on student outcomes. He will range across a number of themes that are known to impact on student learning, raise standards of achievement and help enable students to develop as rounded young adults.

The themes of this interactive session will focus on the core business of schools:

- vision and leadership
- partnership working
- involving staff in a collegial way
- engaging students and parents in ways that they find meaningful
- strengthening a school's ethos and culture of ambition.

Importantly, Frank will look at bringing all these themes together in a balanced way through approaches to self-evaluation that are focused strongly on achieving results, that involve considering measures of success, as well as how to track the progress of improvement projects.

Frank will also take the opportunity to stress the need for long-term culture change so your school can face the future confident that it is preparing young people for the demands of the mid 21st Century.

#### **FRANK CRAWFORD**

HM Chief Inspector of Education, Scotland

Frank Crawford is a Chief Inspector of Education in Scotland with a remit that includes Future Education, best practice and The Journey to Excellence project on school improvement. As Chief Inspector for over a decade, he has advised UK Ministers on Scottish educational issues and, since devolution, Scottish Ministers, as well as local education authorities.

Frank has covered a range of portfolios as Chief Inspector including quality assurance, school audit, a national system of achievement targets, primary education, secondary education, school ethos and educational good practice. He has been involved in a number of international projects ranging across issues such as school improvement, health education and parental engagement. He has spoken at conferences in a number of countries including Canada, Hong Kong, Greece, Germany, Finland and Ireland as well as being a guest speaker at innumerable events in Scotland.

Before joining Her Majesty's Inspectorate of Education, Frank was a senior manager in a secondary school and prior to that was a head of a science department. When a teacher, he was seconded or worked part-time on a range of local and national educational initiatives.
