

# ais NSW Independent Schools at a glance 2016


# **NSW Enrolments by Sector**




## **NSW Schools by Sector**




### **Number of NSW Independent Schools by Level**

#### **Enrolments - 5 Year Trend**




# **Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander Enrolments - 5 Year Trend**







